Assistant Planner Melany Amarillas was present on behalf of The Holt Group to provide information on the Initial Study/ Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) for the Alamo Rivert Trail. She explained that in 2020, the City applied for grant funding for the Alamo River Trail. An environmental analysis was conducted in compliance with CEQA. The results of the analysis were posted and three agencies submitted minor comments. Measures were included in the final MND to address comments. After certifying the MND the City can begin with the reimbursement process and construction.

No public comments were registered during the Public Hearing.

Mr. Wells prepared a list of recommended projects for submission to SCAG for federal funding. The recommended projects being the Cedar Avenue and Melon Avenue improvement projects. Mr. Wells explained that due to short turnaround time for submitting the application for funding, he directed THG to begin the application process. Staff is seeking concurrence from the Council in submitted the recommended projects for funding.

HFD utilizes their system for crucial medical information interfacing. This agreement will allow HFD to continue their use of the Pro Phoenix System by compensating ICSO for their use of the service.

Ms. Rios explained that back in September 2024, the Council approved an agreement with TextMyGov for texting services with Holtville residents. She provided a brief update on the total text messages sent, 46,209, and how many cell phones receive the messages, 1,065. The agreement included a limit of 50,000 text messages, which staff expects to meet before the end of the term. Ms. Rios presented options outlined in the contract for purchasing additional messages: \$750 for 100,000, \$550 for 50,000, and \$300 for 25,000.

SUBJECT: Request by Holtville High School to Issue a Permit for a Professional

Fireworks Display at the 2024 Senior Class Graduation Ceremony

ISSUE:

Shall the City Council take action allowing a permit to be issued to Pyro Spectaculars, Inc. (dba Pyro Spectaculars by Souza) of Alpine, California, to perform a pyrotechnics display at the Holtville High School senior graduation ceremony to be held on Thursday, June 6, 2024, at the HHS Footbal Field?

DISCUSSION:

Staff was approached again this year by HHS administration requesting that they be permitted to engage a pyrotechnics professional to put on a fireworks display at this year's graduation ceremony. Mr. Arevalo, the HHS Principal, has been working with Holtville Fire and the City Finance Department to gather the required paperwork and follow the procedures necessary to allow the display, which they have properly completed.

The City ordinance dealing with fireworks (excerpt attached as Attachment A) allows for such displays by licensed experts with proper insurance coverage. The representatives of the school have engaged Pyro Spectaculars by Souza of San Diego to perform the display. The City has obtained a copy of the firm's liability insurance coverage, naming the City as an additional insured (Attachment B) and the Fire Chief is satisfied with the proposed physical setup, assuming winds are not too strong that evening, which would preclude the demonstration.

A fee is mentioned in the ordinance, however, no fee has been established and it is recommended that any consideration of such a fee be waived for the High School.

FISCAL IMPACT:

None, other than loss of an undetermined fee.

<u>CITY MANAGER RECOMMENDED ACTION:</u>

Allow the issuance of a permit with no fee.

Ordinance 483 (Excerpt)

- vii. Has not had a permit to sell revoked within twenty-four months prior to the organization's submittal of an application for a permit to sell.
- (r) "Safe and Sane Fireworks" (a.k.a. "state-approved fireworks") shall mean "Safe and Sane Fireworks" as set forth in Health and Safety Code Sections 12529 and 12562 and the relevant sections of Title 19, Code of Regulations, Subchapter 6 which are hereby incorporated by reference.
- (s) "Responsible Person" means a person who causes a violation of this Chapter to occur or allows a violation to exist or continue, by his or her action or failure to act, or whose agent, employee or independent contractor causes a violation to occur, or allows a violation to exist or continue. There is a rebuttable presumption that the record owner of a residential parcel, as shown on the county's latest equalized property taxes assessment rolls, and a lessee of a residential parcel has a notice of any violation existing on said property. For purposes of this Chapter, there may be more than one responsible person for a violation. Any person, irrespective of age, found in violation of any provision of this Chapter may be issued a citation in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter. Every parent, guardian or other person, having the legal care, custody or control of any person under the age of 18 years, who knows or reasonably should know that a minor is in violation of this Chapter, may be issued a citation in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter, in addition to any citation that may be issued to the offending minor.
- "Violation" or "Violates" refers to any violation of any provision of this Chapter.

§ GENERAL PROHIBITION AGAINST POSSESSION, SALE OR USE OF FIREWORKS.

Except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, no person shall possess, sell, use, display or explode any "Dangerous Fireworks" including, but not limited to, any rocket, firecracker, roman candle, squib, torpedo, wire core sparkler, wooden core sparkler, black cartridge, aerial shell or other combustible device or explosive substance or any kind of fireworks, by whatsoever name known, or any altered "Safe and Sane Fireworks" within the City of Holtville.

<u>§ EXCEPTION - CERTAIN PUBLIC DISPLAYS AND/OR SPECIAL EFFECTS.</u>

It shall be unlawful to cause, allow, permit, aid, abet, or suffer any discharge of "Dangerous Fireworks" (including a public display) or any use of special effects without having first obtained a permit therefor from the Fire Chief.

The Fire Chief shall have authority to adopt reasonable rules and regulations for the granting of permits for those activities contained in Section 12640 of the California Health and Safety Code, including supervised public displays of fireworks by a jurisdiction, fair association, amusement park, other organization, or for the use of fireworks by artisans in pursuit of their trade. Each such use or display shall be handled by a licensed pyrotechnic operator (as defined by Section 12527 of the California Health and Safety Code) in accordance with a City-issued permit, and shall be of such character and so located, discharged or fired as in the opinion of the Fire Chief or his designee, after proper investigation, will not be hazardous or endanger any person.

Every application for permit to conduct a public display of fireworks shall be accompanied by a non-refundable fee as established by resolution of the City Council. This fee shall be in addition to any fee or tax imposed by the City Council. Every applicant shall agree to hold the City of Holtville, its officers and employees, harmless from any and all claims for damages or other costs arising out of the activity authorized by the permit.

6______ CERTAIN PUBLIC DISPLAYS - LIABILITY INSURANCE.

Any person, firm or corporation applying for a public display permit shall furnish to the Fire Chief proof of coverage by a policy of public liability and property damage insurance. The policy shall provide limits of bodily injury and property damage liability of not less than \$5 million (\$5,000,000) combined single limits for each occurrence annually for payments of damages to persons or property which may result from or be caused by such public display of fireworks, or any negligence on the part of the licensee or his/her/its agents, servants, employees ad/or subcontractors presenting such public display.

No permit shall be issued until the permittee furnishes the Fire Chief with a "Certificate of Insurance" for each policy required, executed by the company issuing said policy and approved as to form by the City Attorney. Such policies shall contain a provision which includes the "City of Holtville" as an additional insured and declares said insurance to be primary and that no other insurance carried by an insured party shall be called upon for contribution. Such insurance policies shall contain an endorsement that the company issuing such policy or policies will not allow the same to be canceled without serving, by first class mail, ten (10) days notice of cancellation upon the City Clerk for the City of Holtville. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, the failure of the permittee to carry such policy or policies in force and to properly renew said insurance during the time covered by such permit shall automatically revoke the permit as of the date of expiration of such insurance policy or policies. A payment of the full amount of the permit fee required by this Ordinance shall be made to the City before any such revoked permit may be reinstated.

6 CERTAIN PUBLIC DISPLAYS - APPEALS.

The decision of the Fire Chief or the Fire Chief's designated representative in acting on an application for a permit to conduct a public display of fireworks in accordance with the provision of this Ordinance shall be subject to an appeal by the applicant to the City Manager. Notice of such appeal shall be filed with the City Manager within ten (10) days after the date of the decision regarding such fireworks permit. Upon failure to file such notice within the tenday period, the action of the Fire Chief's designated representative shall be final and conclusive. The applicant may appeal the decision of the City Manager to the City Council by filing a notice of appeal with the City Clerk within ten (10) days after the date of the City Manager's decision. Upon failure to file such a notice within the ten (10) day, the action of the City Manager shall be final and conclusive.

EXCEPTION - SAFE AND SANE FIREWORKS.

It shall not be unlawful to possess, sale, use, display or discharge, within the City, those fireworks that are defined and classified as "Safe and Sane Fireworks" (a.k.a. "state-approved fireworks") in the California State Fireworks Law (Sections 12500, et seq., of the Health and Safety Code and the relevant sections of Title 19, Code of Regulations, Subchapter 6) during that time period beginning at 12:00 noon on June 30 and ending at midnight on July 5 of that same year.

SAFE AND SANE FIREWORKS - PERMITS REQUIRED.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell "Safe and Sane Fireworks" within the City without having first applied for and received a permit therefore, from the City.

§ SAFE AND SANE FIREWORKS - APPLICATION.

- (a) No nonprofit organization shall submit more than one (1) application for a permit to sell "Safe and Sane Fireworks" within the City. If more than one (1) application is submitted on behalf of any nonprofit organization, including an affiliated organization, all such requests shall be voidable at the discretion of the Fire Chief. If a question arises as to whether organizations and/or groups are affiliated, the City Council shall have ultimate authority to decide said question. Any attempt to transfer an application shall void any and all applications filed by or on behalf of both the transferor/nonprofit organization and the transferee/nonprofit organization.
- (b) All applications for permits to sell "Safe and Sane Fireworks" shall be in writing to the City Clerk on forms supplied by the City. Applications may be filed beginning April 1 of each year up to and including April 15 of the same year, at which time the filing period for that year will be closed.

Applications shall be accompanied by an assurance that, if the permit is issued to the applicant, the applicant shall, at the time of receipt of such of permit, deliver to the City a certificate evidencing an occurrence-based policy of insurance naming the "City of Holtville" as an additional insured thereunder, with the following minimum limits: \$1,000,000 public liability and property damage; and general aggregate coverage of \$2,000,000. No policy will be acceptable which contains a provision allowing a deductible amount.



SUBJECT: Sale of Fireworks

ISSUE:

Shall the City Council approve the request by the Holtville Chamber of Commerce to obtain the Single Vendor Permit allowed by City Ordinance for the Sale of "Safe and Sane Fireworks" in Association with 2025 Independence Day Celebrations?

DISCUSSION:

Ordinance No. 483 (2014), allows a maximum of one (1) temporary fireworks stand permit to be issued by the City each calendar year. To be eligible to be awarded the permit, the organization must be a local non-profit, tax exempt entity qualified under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The primary purpose for limiting the number of stands to one is to avoid diluting the profits between such organizations. The ordinance allows the sale of fireworks to commence on June 28th and conclude on July 5th at 9:00 p.m., for a total of seven days. From 2013-2024 (except in 2016 when no permit was issued), the Holtville Chamber of Commerce has been the vendor issued the permit. The Chamber has once again requested that they be the sole local fireworks vendor.

FISCAL IMPACT:

\$500 permit revenue for the City, which offsets additional staffing required during the 4th of July and the adjacent weekend.


CITY MANAGER RECOMMENDATION:

Given that no other group has come forward to request the permit and the limited window of time to complete the state permitting requirements, it is recommended that the Chamber be issued the City permit.



SUBJECT: City Manager Update

ADMINISTRATION

Public Safety Lot/New Construction - Rubio Medina of Irvine, California was engaged in April, 2023, to perform Architecture services to design Phase I (Fire Apparatus Bay) and Phase II (PS Administration & Fire Dormitories) of this project. Staff met with Mr. Medina multiple times in early May, wherein iterative documents were discussed and revised. Pursuant to discussions between Council, Chief Silva, the CM and Mr. Medina regarding configuration, direction solidified for constructing a 3-bay apparatus section and a 2story administration/residence area. Further discussion also clarified the placement of the building on the site and the external motif of the building. Mr. Medina moved forward with subconsultants for plumbing, electrical, HVAC, etc. Due to an increase in the size of the project over that which was called out in the RFP. the architect has approached the City about augmented funding, which may be brought to Council in the future. More solid delineation of cost estimates for the phasing of the project were presented in August and presented to Council for consideration. A status update meeting with Mr. Medina was held via Zoom in late January. Chief Silva and the CM got an update, wherein Medina estimated submission of plans for first plan check to be middle to late February. Chief Silva has continued to meet virtually with the architect and subconsultants on various issues over the past few weeks. The full set of drawings were finally submitted to the plan check firm in late April. This process is expected to be iterative with the architect, with multiple redlines and resubmissions, however, staff expects the entire process to be less than 60 days,

Staff met with representatives of USDA Rural Development in late 2024 to discuss financing the remaining unfunded portion of the project. Unfortunately, although their website notes capability of disadvantaged communities with populations under 12,000 to apply for 50% grant, 50% loan funding, that program is capped at \$50,000 for grants, so any hope that grant funding may be available is not there. Rates were adjusted on October 1, from 4% down to 3.75%, so the loan payment calculation improved, but not drastically.

Multiple conversations regarding augmented funding have taken place with staff, Council, and various entities. The CM compiled information from various sources and submitted an application for directed Congressional funding to Raul Ruiz's office in early May. The City received word that the project was selected by the Congressman and recommended to the Congressional budget committee. Although we were notified in March that the Congressman's projects were not funded, his office subsequently informed staff that the project will be resubmitted in the next round of funding. Staff will continue to work with the Congressman's office in hopes that the funding will be secured in the coming fiscal year.

Staff continues to pursue additional funding sources. At the 2024 League of Cities Annual Conference, Councilmen Anderson and Goodsell joined the CM in multiple conversations with firms and organizations that show promise as potential funding sources. One salient proposal was received on which Council requested further research. The contact led to a two-year agreement in February with the CrisCom Company to represent the City in pursuing funding.

In late April, the CM and Mayor Goodsell flew to Sacramento in association with a League of Cities event and had an opportunity to meet with our state legislators regarding directed funding for the project. We were

also able to dovetail into ongoing conversations between ICSO and these representatives for funding their own Imperial County project. Budget funding will be tight, due to state shortfalls, but this work, along with assistance from CrisCom, put the City in a very favorable position to capture any potential windfalls.

Annual Financial Audit – the City's auditors from Moss, Levy, and Hartzheim were onsite recently. The CM has once again had to set aside most other tasks over the past few weeks to prepare for and subsequently respond to issues with the audit, functioning as the lead on this required activity. Some deficiencies in finance activities were discovered in the process that have required further subsequent work. The CM has continued to function nearly exclusively to rectify these issues over the past two months. Almost all information has now been forwarded and the auditors will be back onsite May15 and 16 to complete testing.

Events – Mayor Goodsell, Councilman Munger and the CM attended the annual SCAG general Assembly and Conference in Palm Desert last week. As usual, there were some informative sessions on broad topics affecting the City. A good deal of work was put in between sessions, however, in side conversations with various staff of ICTC and SCAG. We continued to seek additional funding for the Public Safety Building project, but did gain some valuable insight into the upcoming funding opportunities for transportation projects.

PUBLIC WORKS

TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

Pear Canal Undergrounding/Ninth Street Improvements (Olive to Melon) – Initial action to proceed with this project was taken in early 2021. A deposit was forwarded to IID to begin design and multiple site visits with staff, the IID and City Engineer took place to discuss issues that needed to be addressed in design. Undergrounding work was scheduled to take place in December 2021, however, delays were discussed in those meetings from the IID side which eventually led to construction work being pushed back.

IID had procured Congressional funding for the project that the City was asked to administer. Late in the process, it was relayed to staff that by taking on administration of the funding, the City would now be responsible for paying the 11.47% matching funds necessary for the grant, which could be in the neighborhood of \$100k. Nevertheless, an agreement was approved with IID to administer the funding in October. The closing financial paperwork with Caltrans remains. The CM met with IID in early March to discuss their upcoming billing for the work done on the project and what amount would be left for the City to recoup for our expenditures. It is evident that IID came in under the construction estimate and there is opportunity for the City to recoup the bulk of its cash outlay for the project. *Through a couple of conversations with IID, it was revealed that they have been awaiting a document from the City, which was provided this week. A recent email reflected that the final billing is now forthcoming.*

The City was awarded funding through ICTC for the resulting necessary sidewalk and roadway improvements early in the process. LC Engineering was awarded the contract for design in February, 2024. Delays with the undergrounding project pushed back the start of the sidewalk project, necessitating a time extension. A web conference was held in September to clarify the need to move a portion of the funding for the street project into the current fiscal year. With the undergrounding project complete, staff will prepare an RFP to begin the construction of the curb, gutter and sidewalk, along with the minor pavement necessary to widen the roadway. Staff began discussion with the City Engineer in January to develop the RFP for this project to be released in March, however, we are currently awaiting clearance to proceed from Caltrans.

Pine Avenue Sidewalks — Subsequent to the awards of funding for streets projects utilizing Federal Highways dollars through ICTC in early 2022, another year of projects was quickly requested to be added. Holtville submitted a project to capture CMAQ dollars to add sidewalks to either side of Pine Avenue between Fourth and Fifth Streets. Action to approve was taken in October, 2023. Staff began discussion with the City Engineer in March to develop a Design RFP for this project for release in in April.

2025 Call for Projects – this topic was brought to City Council in late April to approve two projects suggested by staff. Pursuant to conversations at the SCAG Conference, the CM requested that planning staff work up and submit two additional projects by the due date.

Capital Improvements Project Listing – a meeting was held in November, 2023, with staff, including the City Manager, City Engineer, City Planner and Water/Wastewater Lead Operator to discuss long term capital improvements needed in the City. Water system improvements, sewer system upgrades, streets projects and other issues were discussed and expected to be further explored. A more complete detailing of the discussion will be presented to the Council in the near future. Council has requested that this issue be moved up in the queue and this be addressed shortly. Staff reinitialized discussions and had some preliminary information on the late-April agenda.

PARKS

Railroad Trestle Repair – A grant was secured from the California Natural Resources Agency to repair the railroad trestle burned in a river bottom fire several years ago. This is necessary to connect the Trail to east side of the river and eventually the future Wetlands area. After over a decade and a half of being somewhat unsightly and unusable, the trestle will soon be fixed cosmetically and usable for pedestrian and non-motorized traffic. Documentation was finally signed for this grant in late October, 2021. The City Engineer completed the technical specification for the Scope of Work in June 2022 for the RFP. A decision was made to forestall the bid process a bit to allow construction costs to stabilize. Eventually, Kleinfelder, Inc., was selected for Design services in April. A meeting with the design team was held in early May wherein various facets of the project were discussed. Multiple ideas to control costs and stretch the project dollars were decided upon. The decision was made to proceed with the general direction of keeping the original character of the structure, while making concessions to keep costs under control.

A January update meeting between the Design team, the City Planner and the CM revealed that the project had stalled due to a needed topographical study that the consultant thought the City would provide. After discussion, Kleinfelder engaged a local consultant to produce the document and the project is back in motion. Pursuant to a periodic plan check, reprioritization of the elements to be completed vis a vis available funding was amended in May. Kleinfelder provided 90% plans in late September, so this phase nears completion. Included in that plan set were construction estimates. After some analysis, staff will be bringing this to Council to approve advertising and bidding. THG reviewed the plans and sent them back to Kleinfelder for clarification and/or correction. The revised plans were resubmitted and further comments were sent back by THG. 95% plans were received on Monday, 2/10, with some minor adjustments still needed. Staff is currently working to procure the final environmental and cultural clearances so that the project can go to bid, likely within the next month.

City staff is attempting to take advantage of available funding from the IID to augment paying for this project through a green spaces grant for planting trees. As there is a significant component of the project to add trees along the leadup trail and the proposed park at the base of the trestle, funding was requested to offset those expenses.

Holtville East Trail Link - The City Manager had multiple discussions in recent years about a Trail extension from the Trestle to the Country Club area, then to the UC Research station and eventually to Hwy 111 for easier access to IVC with active transportation funding options. The idea has been well received by SCAG staff and the head of County Public Works. An application for Active Transportation funding was developed in mid-2024 and a grant application was submitted in June to fund design of the project.

Mellinger Alamo River Trail - A grant was awarded in early 2024 to River Partners, a non-profit that deals in habitat restoration, for a project that would include a Wetlands trail spur. RP met with the City Manager and toured the site, then engaged Nicklaus Engineering to design the project. Staff was contacted

by NEI in March to discuss design elements. River Partners staff continued to meet with the CM throughout the Spring and early Summer, performing a few physical "scouting" trips to decide the best path for the trail extension. They have done some preliminary exploration and soil sampling and continue to move the project forward. A tentative map was forwarded to the City this week. The original template is aggressive (i.e. "Expensive"), so it is assumed that discussions and concessions will be forthcoming. River Partners presented a slightly revised plan to the Council in early October to get feedback on the direction of the project. Staff met virtually with River Partners in mid-December, with some minor adjustments to the plans discussed. A regrouping meeting was held in February – we are awaiting a few studies to proceed with the next steps in finalizing design and procuring funding. The City has been working with the Institute for Local Government on support for various projects, so they met with RP in early March to eventually assist with procuring construction grants when the time arises. A progress meeting this week revealed that a cultural resources report is being produced, after which project costing will continue and scoping can be discussed.

<u>BUILDING DEPT</u> - The City has issued 33 building permits in 2025. A list of permits issued by month is available on the City's website at https://www.holtville.ca.gov/building-planning/building-and-planning/building-department/

Melon, LLC Housing Project (± 50) – A project has been in the works for some time at the northeast corner of Ninth and Melon, just outside the City limits. After years of confusion regarding the process, the project's ownership group, led by John Hawk, engaged Development Design & Engineering in 2016 to assist in moving the project along. DD&E completed CEQA compliance, and a Mitigated Negative Declaration was adopted by the Planning Commission and City Council in late 2020.

The project was presented at the Planning Commission in October 2020 and drew a good deal of public opposition. PC action pushed the project forward with a designation of allowing R-1 or R-2 development, with Council accepting the PC recommendation in November, 2020. The denser R-2 zoning designation would allow up to 8 units per acre or approximately 65 units. The annexation was approved by LAFCo in February, 2021. We await further submission from the project proponent.

Staff spoke with Mr. Hawk multiple times to remind him that there are still several requirements to move his project forward, which he could be doing concurrently with the preparation and construction of the IID and City improvements. He said he will be speaking to his partners. As the undergrounding and street work are imminent, he still needs to produce a site plan, building plans, pull permits, etc. The City's project should now have no bearing on his timeline. This was reiterated to Mr. Hawk again in January and again in July. The CM spoke with Mr. Hawk today and he conveyed a desire to sell the project, which is now listed for sale.

AMG Sunset Rose Senior Apartments (± 33) – In July, 2022, the City was granted HOME funding for this AMG & Associates apartment project, proposed in the area of Third and Grape. This will create some long-term oversight by the City, but it does continue to add housing. A subdivision map was approved for the property. A consultant to administer this grant was engaged in May, 2022, and an application for additional subsidized financing was approved by the City in late November.

A pre-submittal meeting was held in early November to discuss necessary aspects to the construction with the project proponent, including offsite improvements. Much of the discussion centered on handling stormwater. Final map and the necessary proposed lot split were approved in late February as well. Since the closing of the financing, several paperwork/compliance issues cropped up that the City was left to work on. This was not the "deal" as originally presented, so staff sought assistance. Staff met with HCD representatives on this project in October. We are hoping they will assist in working with the contractor to get the project running more smoothly.

Start was delayed as construction bids came in significantly over projections. The developer had made a drawdown on funding, however, the ownership group has been somewhat unresponsive as the project sat in limbo for some time. An extension on their CUP was requested and was granted by Planning Commission

in May, 2024, then a pre-construction meeting with the developer and City was finally held in January. Construction is in progress, which the Building Inspector is overseeing.

The construction superintendent has requested to perform some work in the coming months overnight. Staff is currently examining the proposal.

AMG Pine Crossing Apartments (± 64) – This is a proposed mirror image project across from Fern Crossing complex. The Building Inspector and City Engineer have coordinated with a plan check firm on the plans that were first submitted in June. After a few iterations and resubmissions, the building plans were approved in early October. AMG is still working with The City Engineer and staff on finalizing all site work and off-site plans for utilities and stormwater handling. Dirt work on the project has begun. Staff met with the City Engineer to discuss issues with handling of stormwater for the property multiple times. A property boundary issue has surfaced with the lot to the north that will require examination. A phone conference was held with the developer and staff and discuss some issues regarding requirements of the City, then the CM met with the Construction superintendent multiple times in March to finalize City requirements. The design engineer has resubmitted plans for a contested water line and preliminary grading has begun.

Peri & Sons Ag Labor Housing (66) – this project was introduced to Planning Commission earlier this week. It proposes to construct USDA-approved dormitory style housing for up to 660 H2A Visa Program agriculture laborers working for the applicant firm. PC approved the site plan and density waiver contingent on City Council approval of the land use designation and Conditional Use Permit. A Public Hearing was held at a subsequent City Council meeting and the project was approved. We will now await more definitive site plans and building design for review.

WATER ENTERPRISE

Rate Study – The profitability of the Water Enterprise has been problematic in recent years. Coupled with the debt covenant to budget a net revenue of 120% of the annual debt service, a rate adjustment has been explored. A formal Water Rate Study must be completed, which will be brought back for discussion at some point in the future.






The following is a summary of statistics for the Holtville Sheriff's Deputies for the month of **April 2025.**


Calls for Service:

➤ 318 total incident reports, which were entered into Pro Phoenix Computer Database by the Imperial County Sheriff's Dispatch Center. These calls consisted of requests for Sheriff's services.









The following is a brief summary of incidnets and events that the Holtville Police Department has been involved in during the month of April 2025.

25-11071 Petty Theft: Holtville Garden Apartments

RP reported the theft of a fire extinguisher, possibly occurred on Wednesday. The deputy contacted RP who advised unknown subject took extinguisher on Wednesday night. RP provided video footage and subject appeared to be white male in his 40s.

25-11212 – Traffic Stop - 5th Street and Holt Avenue

Traffic stop was conducted for a lighting violation. After contacting the driver, it was learned that the driver did not have a valid or current driver's license. The driver was cited for the lighting violation and for being unlicensed. The vehicle was towed.

25-11235 – Suspicious – 500 block Olive Avenue

RP reported her sister's ex-boyfriend, is the restrained person of a restraining order and must stay away at least 100 yards from the sister or the residence. Deputies arrived and searched for the suspect and were not able to locate him.

25-11284 Flagdown: 5th Street & Holt Avenue

RP reported he was talking to an unknown subject on social media and the subject is now requesting \$500 dollars or would share explicit photos of him online. RP advised he already sent \$300 dollars via bitcoin and Venmo. Per RP he does not know who the subject is, and he was provided with a case number for refund claim purposes and was counseled on online safety.

25-11557 Sonrisa

RP, staff member of Sonrisa, advised of a disturbance involving a female tenant. RP reported that the female was yelling, destroying property, and physically striking others. Deputy responded to the

facility and spoke with all parties involved. Victim did not want to press charges and all parties were advised of their options.

25-11865 Dollar General

RP advised a male subject driving in the parking lot of Dollar General had struck another vehicle and almost hit people walking, possibly under the influence of alcohol. Deputy arrived and contacted RP who stated the gray Hyundai Elantra hit another vehicle that was parked and attempted to flee, but RP was able to stop him by reaching into the vehicle from the driver window and removing the keys out of the ignition. The deputy spoke with driver who was seated in the driver seat and noticed signs of impairment: slurred speech, glossy eyes, and an odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle. The deputy conducted a field sobriety test and determined driver was under the influence of alcohol and was arrested for DUI.

25-12068- Assault – Holtville Garden Apartments

RP requested a report for her mother, regarding her brother who assaulted her mother. Deputies arrived and contacted the victim, who said her son assaulted her by covering her mouth. Victim said her son spat in her face three times, grabbed a kitchen knife, and told victim that he would kill her and then kill himself. A search for a suspect was conducted and we were unable to locate him.

25-12143 Traffic Stop: 6th Street & Orange Avenue

Deputy conducted a traffic stop on black SUV for traffic violations. Deputy contacted the driver, and passenger. A records check revealed both subjects had an active arrest warrant out of LA county for traffic offenses. The driver was later cited and released with a future court date and the passenger was booked into jail for the warrant mentioned.

25-12146 Suspicious: 600 Block 5th Street

RP advised she saw a white Honda Civic occupied by 3 females and 1 male juvenile wearing a mask and carrying a black firearm as others filmed him at corner store, Chestnut & 5th Street. Unknown if real or fake, advised subjects were still in the parking lot at time of call. Deputies arrived at Union Food Market and contacted cashier who stated 5 juveniles had just bought ski masks and BB guns from him. Deputies later located the vehicle at 7-Eleven and followed juveniles to their residences. All parents were contacted and advised of the call. BB guns were turned over to parents. Parents stated he will be throwing them away. Negative crime, juveniles were counseled.

25-12810 Fire: 600 Block Pine Avenue

RP reporting subject burning a fire, suspect left on bike, last seen wearing a brown hoodie on a black bike. Deputy contacted the male who was later issued a city cite#H053 for violation of HMC14.16.040 & HMC14.16.050.

25-12895 – Pedestrian Check – Chestnut Avenue and 7th Street

A Hispanic male juvenile was noticed carrying a can (Unknown at the time if it was a beer can) and tried to hide it from the deputy. As the deputy parked his patrol vehicle to inquire about the type of can the juvenile carried, he took off running and threw the can (Miller Lite) on the street. A search of the juvenile was conducted but was unsuccessful in locating him.

25-12910 – Disturbance – Hot Rods

RP reported four males in a physical fight outside the Hot Rods Bar. Deputy arrived and contacted RP who stated a male threw a glass beer bottle from the sidewalk into the courtyard of Hot Rods landing and shattered near citizens. Deputy contacted the male subject who was extremely intoxicated

and uncooperative. When Deputy attempted to detain the male subject, he resisted arrest, and after a brief struggle he was arrested. While the deputy was trying to take the subject into custody his girlfriend interfered by placing herself between them and wouldn't let the deputy handcuff the male. They both got arrested for being drunk in public and resisting arrest.

25-13177 Animal Control

Both neighbors came to an agreement for the loss of the chickens.

RP advised that her brother was currently at her mom's residence and had physically assaulted the mother by choking her and covering her mouth. Prior to arrival, Deputy confirmed with ICSO dispatch that the restraining order against suspect was still active and valid. Deputy made verbal announcements identifying himself as law enforcement. The door was then opened by the victim. Victim stated that her son had exited the residence prior to law enforcement arrival. The deputy conducted a protective sweep of the apartment for officer safety and to confirm the suspect was no longer inside. The suspect was not located during the sweep and the victim advised that her son had fled through a rear window. A perimeter check and patrol were conducted by Deputies with negative results in locating the suspect.

The purpose of this report is to inform council of all operations and maintenance activities carried out at the Water & Wastewater treatment facilities during the period between 04/22/2025 thru 05/05/2025.

WATER PLANT:

- I am pleased to report that all water quality samples taken from the <u>2.4 MG tank</u> proved satisfactory, and after obtaining water board approval, staff proceeded to place the tank back into service during the week of April 27th. The new <u>Cathodic Protection</u> equipment is scheduled for start-up during mid-May.
- Exquisite Pools completed the installation of both new <u>Pentair recirculation pumps</u> and <u>Variable Frequency Drive controller</u>, and placed both units into service during the week of May 4th. (see attached photos).

WASTEWATER PLANT:

 All parts and materials required to replace the <u>Biolac aeration diffuser membranes</u> have arrived on site, and staff is coordinating the project with EDI field reps.


